You do the math...

Darkness comes early in fall and winter months. In fact, more pedestrian collisions occur November through February, generally from 4-8p.m.

A child walking during darkness or in low-light conditions wearing dark colors is first seen approximately 55 feet away. This gives a driver less than 1 second of reaction time.

This chart lists the distance at which a driver will first see a pedestrian depending on the color of their clothing

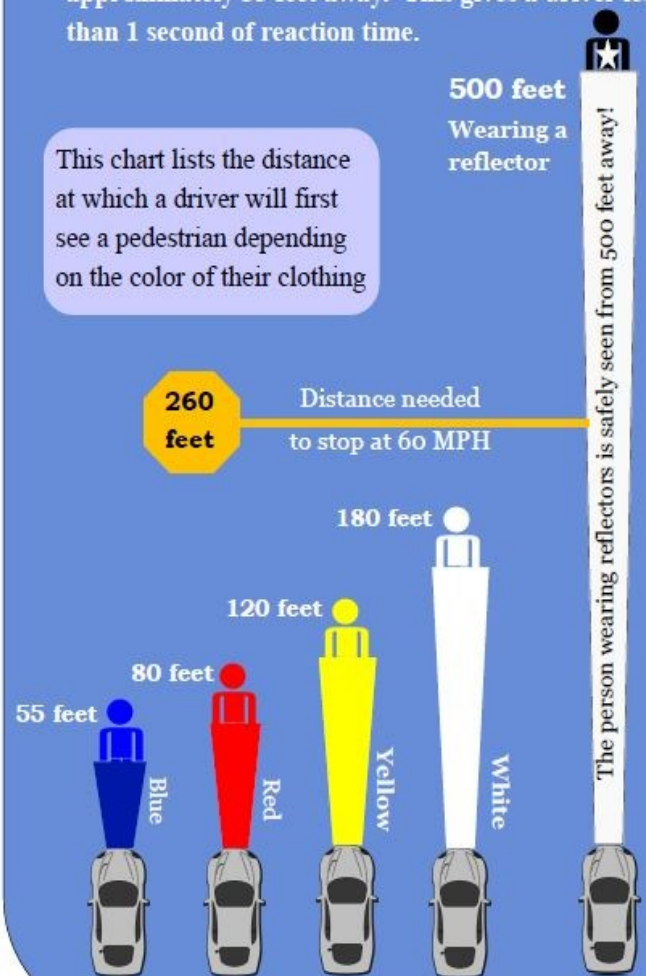
